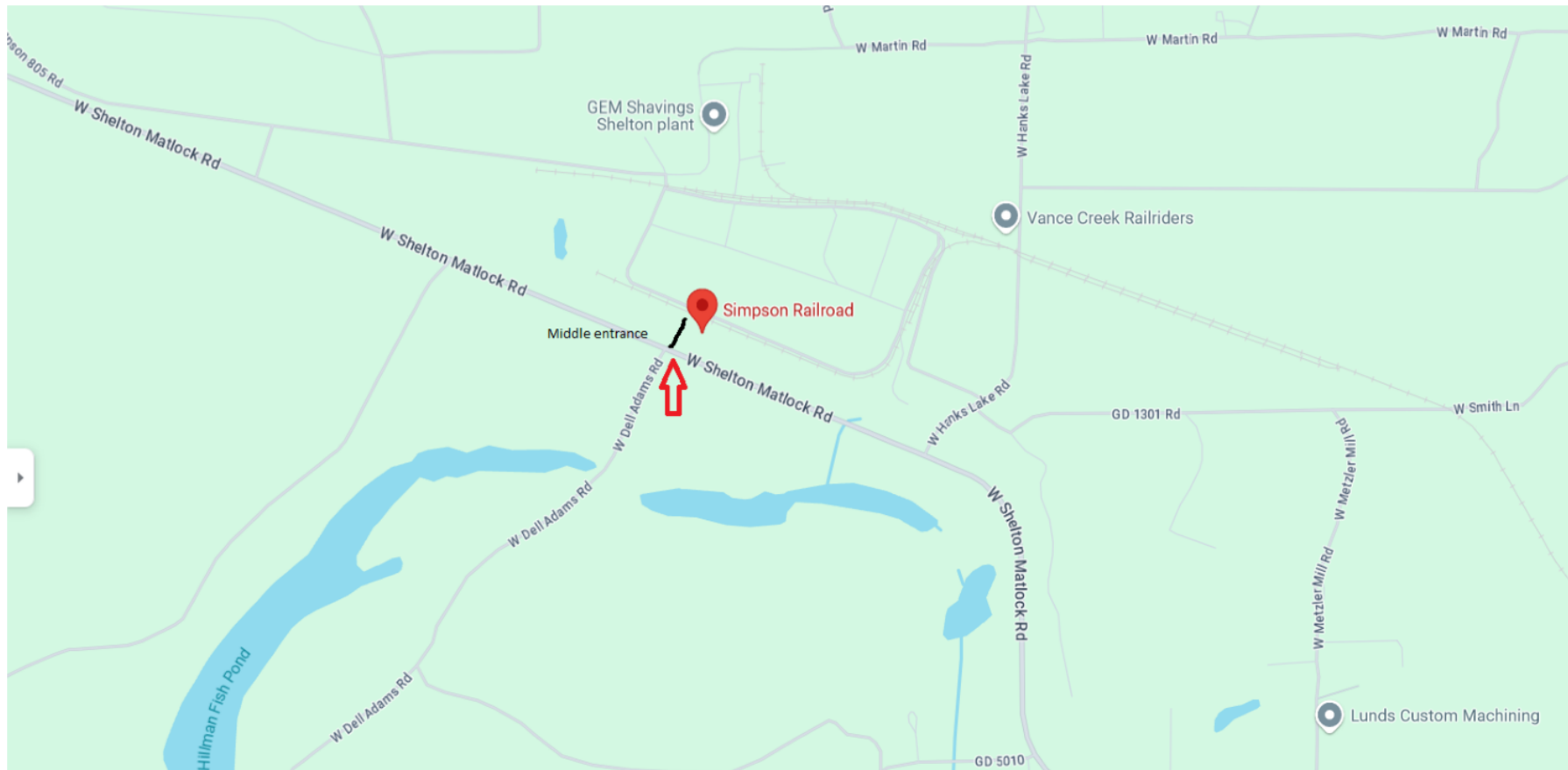

Take a ride aboard the historic Simpson railroad on one of our historic cabooses. Sit on the open platform in the sunshine and open air of caboose 1201 or in the modern steel caboose 201. Both have cupola seating to get above the trains for a better view. A sweet treat will be served inside the museum for all guest to enjoy on a warm summer afternoon. Take a few minutes to talk to museum volunteers, and browse the historic displays inside the museum. For those interested a limited number can Upgrade to the locomotive cab for a completely different experience.

We are located inside the middle entrance of the Still Water Industrial Park (former Simpson Sort Yard/Mill 5). We are Off of Shelton Matlock Rd. approx. mile post 10

Note– we are not off of Hanks lake road or near the Vance Creek Rail riders.

The depot is next to the historic log car

When we are operating signs direct you to the parking area.

From 101 go west on Shelton Matlock Rd approximately 9 miles (mile post 10)

From Matlock travel east on Shelton Matlock Rd about 2 miles past Lake Nahwatzel

Watch for the large Red and white road side sign at our driveway on Shelton Matlock Rd.
